

Software Quality Assurance Part 2 By: Michael Maldonado

Benefits of Software Development - SQA Cooperation:

Motivation to Cooperate: The organization's Software Development department and the Software Quality Assurance (SQA) department can create synergy by working together to achieve a common goal, that is, a software product that reaches the customer with no defects or issues. This type of cooperation provides benefits for all parties involved. The motivation factors for the SQA department and the Software Development department to cooperate are many and include the following:

- Higher productivity, lower cost and reduce waste in both departments
- Improved time to market with higher process and product quality and compliance
- Improved morale of both the Software Development and SQA departments

Hazards of Contention Between Software Development and SQA:

A lack of cooperation between the Software Development department and the Software Quality Assurance (SQA) department can lead to animosity between the two departments and result in an undesirable impact on the end product that is delivered to the organization's customer. The hazards of contention between the Software Development department and the SQA department are many and include the following:

- Lower productivity, greater cost and increased waste in both departments
- Quality issues and compliance problems that negatively affect the organization's performance
- Frustration and distrust by both the Software Development and SQA departments

Software Support:

Lending Services: Delinquent Warning Messages:

- After loading Release 7.90, when delinquent loans were closed, the delinquent warning was not being removed from members accounts. A fix is now included n 7.91. Until all credit unions are updated with Release 7.91, and IQ update can be done to remove the delinquent warning from the members accounts.
- Open a ticket for System Support requesting the following:
 - Please complete IQ_Update to remove on Member level the WARNDQ_FLAG. You will also want to make sure that the WARNDQ_FLAG on the Loan level is changed from a 9 to 0.

Project Implementation:

- Since migration began of NB 4.0 we have 166 clients live.
 There are currently 63 clients left to migrate this year before we can sunset NB 2; which is slated to be sunset before the New Year. Wendy Randall and Cindy Hart work daily on moving over the remaining NetBranch Clients.
- Robin Houston has implemented 22 clients since the
 Fiserv Mobiliti project rollout. The Galaxy NB Mobile
 product is slated for sunset by February 28, 2013; we currently have 29 clients using this project that are not scheduled to migrate as of July.
- Forms Department will be working on updating forms for Credit Unions for 13 of the current forms. The forms with the changes are Risk-Based Pricing and Adverse Action forms. The changes must be completed by January 1, 2013. Forms will be installed before this date to meet the deadline.
- Amy McNeil is working on switching all clients using US
 Central for their ACH and draft processing over to a new
 processor along with completing the ACH, drafts, and
 credit insurance projects for the Southwest Louisiana and
 Universal Mergers.
- Deb Morton completed development and beta tested the Intermediate CQCS participant Guide in August.

Nutrition to Live By

- 2 cups double-strength brewed coffee
- 1 cup milk
- 1/4 cup honey
- 2 cups crushed ice

Directions:

Mix together the coffee, milk and honey in a large pitcher with a whisk until the honey is dissolved. Chill for at least one hour. Before serving, blend coffee mixture and ice in a blender until smooth and frothy. Serve immediately. Serves two.

Honey Berry Tea:

- 2 cups freshly brewed green tea, chilled
- 1 pint fresh berries
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1 can (6 ounces) frozen orange juice concentrate

Directions:

In a blender, combine the berries and honey and blend until smooth. Add orange juice concentrate and process until well blended. Stir mixture into cooled tea in a large pitcher. Serve immediately over ice. Serves two.

Summer Honey Smoothie:

- 2 medium peeled bananas
- 1 cup fresh berries
- 2 cups milk
- 1 cup plain yogurt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1/2 cup crushed ice cubes

Directions:

Blend all ingredients except the ice cubes in a blender. Add the ice and blend until smooth. Serve Immediately. Serves two.


Weight Watchers Zucchini Bread:

Ingredients:

- 2 sprays of butter-flavor cooking spray
- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- 2/3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tbsp ground cinnamon
- 3 egg whites
- 1 large egg
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/3 cup canola oil
- 2/3 cup unsweetened applesauce
- 2 cups uncooked zucchini, peeled, grated, and drained (You will need about 1 1/2 medium zucchinis, about 3/4 lb, to yield 2 cups shredded zucchini)
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- 12 cup raisin, finely chopped

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350. Coat two 8x4 inch loaf pans with cooking spray; set aside.
- In a large bowl, sift together whole-wheat flour, all-purpose flour, salt, baking soda, baking powder, and cinnamon; set aside.
- Using and electric mixer, in a large mixing bowl, beat egg whites until frothy. Add egg, sugar, vanilla extract, oil and applesauce, and beat until thoroughly combined; beat in zucchini.
- Add sifted ingredients to egg mixture and mix well; fold in nuts and raisins. Pour batter into prepared pans and bake in middle of oven until a toothpick inserted in center of bread comes out clean, about 50 to 60 minutes. Slice each bread into about 10 pieces and serve warm or at room temperature. Yields 1 slice per serving.

This Month in History

- 9/1/1985 Almost 75 years after the Titanic sank, an American-French expedition force located the wreck on the ocean floor 12,500 feet down, about 350 miles southeast of Newfoundland, Canada.
- 9/2/1789 The U.S. Treasury Department was established by Congress.
